Sub: Representation requesting to stop the process of Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of Electoral Rolls in Andhra Pradesh- reg-

Honourable Sir,

We, on behalf of various Political parties and different Organisations wish to bring the following to your notice and request that the implementation of SIR process to be stopped henceforth in the State.

We express serious concern regarding the move to implement the special Intensive Revision of Electoral Rolls (SIR) program in the state, which has not been notified by the Election Commission of India as per the Representation of People's Act and is still sub-judice in the Supreme Court. The preparations undertaken by the administrative machinery, up to the polling booth level, without issuing any such notification are illegal. Hence, we request the Election Commission to suspend the SIR implementation process in the state. We also urge that an all-party meeting be convened immediately.

Experience of SIR implementation in Bihar, lead to serious controversy. Poor, migratory laborers, minority communities, and those opposed to the ruling parties were lost voting right. Additionally, it was revealed that lakhs of people were fraudulently added to the rolls in states like Haryana and Karnataka. It is unfortunate that the Election Commission didn't take any action even on specifically exposed cases. While the responsibility lies with the Election Commission to register all adults as voters as per the Representation of the People's Act, its stance that enrolment to be done only if citizenship records are available. The Hon'ble Supreme Court intervened and some corrective measures were taken. That case is still under trial. Despite this, the Election Commission has issued notifications for the controversial SIR implementation in nine other states and three Union Territories.












Even though Andhra Pradesh is not in the list of states announced by the Election Commission, undertaking preparations for this controversial SIR implementation in our state is an illegal action. It is not proper to impose the responsibility on adults, who were not listed in the 2002 voter list from two decades ago, to now produce certificates and get themselves registered as voters. Denying the crucial right to vote in a parliamentary democracy makes a mockery of the democratic process.

We appeal that the controversial SIR implementation process, which has not been notified for Andhra Pradesh as per the Representation of the People Act and already sub-judice in the Supreme Court should not be implemented in the state. The preparations undertaken for it be suspended immediately.

We urge that an all-party meeting be convened promptly on this critical issue.
